



# Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center Update

October 2013

Construction is moving forward on this very important safety improvement project to provide transit services in the Takoma/Langley Crossroads region. PEPCO and the other utility companies are about to complete their relocations along University Boulevard and New Hampshire Avenue.

As discussed during the August community meeting, construction for this project has been carefully planned to ensure that the regional transit services, traffic and local businesses are minimally impacted.



## Projected Schedule of Construction

### Fall 2013 - Early Spring 2014

- Modifications to the MD 193 median and the entrances to the Langley Park and Hampshire Langley Shopping Centers to create a fully signalized intersection.
- Minor drainage improvements along MD 193.
- Modifications to the Lebanon Street/MD 650 signal to allow left turns onto MD 650 North.
- Modifications at Anne Avenue to regulate traffic flow into the intersection.
- Removal and replacement of crosswalks.
- Minor repairs to the curb at MD 193/Lebanon Street.

### Early Spring 2014 - Summer 2014

- Modifications to the Langley Park Shopping Center entrance and drive aisle adjacent to the Bank of America.
- Construction of an island to separate drive lanes from the future bus loop and create a pedestrian walking path.
- Modifications to the Langley Park Shopping Center entrance at MD 193 by the Taco Bell.

### Summer 2014 - Fall/Winter 2015

- Modifications to the median on MD 193 by the Taco Bell, including replacement of the traffic signal.
- Modifications to the entrance to the Hampshire Langley Shopping Center across from the Taco Bell.
- Construction of the Transit Center.

At the request of the community, international and multilingual signs will be used to guide pedestrians and advise the public that all businesses will remain open during construction. The Taco Bell is expected to remain open until Spring.

**Please expect some transit services to be relocated during construction. Service users should watch for notices of those changes.**

Once constructed, WMATA has agreed to staff, manage and maintain the center, with some financial assistance provided by the State.
